Instructions for completing the Watson-Glaser Critical Thinking Appraisal - Form B or A

Step 1

The WGCTA is a measure of how you learn new information, analyze it, and make decisions. Unlike the other questionnaires you may complete, this one does have correct and incorrect answers. It is important that you are able to concentrate.

Please complete the WGCTA:

- \circ when you are well rested.
- where you will not be interrupted. It is not a timed test, but it takes about an hour to complete.
- when you can complete it in its entirety (the whole questionnaire without taking a break)

You were looking at the "My Assessment" page of the TAD website when you downloaded these instructions.

Once you click the "take" link under pending assessments. It will then take you to a screen like this. ------ \rightarrow

There are boxes with I, E, or a number in them. The I is for Instruction pages, the E is for Example pages and the number represents the question number.
